<u>CONTENT</u>	<p>Erasmus Seminar Programme, is the general name of the seminars that are held by visitor professors who are coming from 30 different law faculties around the Europe. This course is an elective course for all year students. As it is obvious the importance of having knowledge about the English terminology on law, the best way to serve his opportunity for law faculty students is to organize seminars which are held in English. For this reason, all Erasmus Seminars are held in English. 2010-2011 Spring Semester 5 Professors from Leiden Law School, Netherlands are held seminars on "European Human Rights Law". In this context the European Court of Human Rights, European Union Law, Constitutional Law, Civil Law is discussed. A professor from Central Lancashire University Law School, United Kingdom, has given a seminar on Medical Law and Law of Obligations. Another instructor from Slovenia, Ljubljana University gave a seminar on criminal law. By the same academic staff, "Basic Concepts of Law" seminars were given 2 times a week for the first year students. Not only the undergraduate students but also the research assistants in the faculty have an interest in these seminars. It is planned to continue these seminars in more various areas.</p>

<u>CONTENT</u>	<p>This course consists of two modules. The <i>Comparative Criminal Law</i> part includes a discussion of selected comparative issues in criminal law including the basic concepts and a contextual perspective on different legal systems, criminal or administrative responsibility (theory and ECHR jurisdiction; also TR and HU cases), the principle of ne bis in idem (theory, international instruments, EU, cases), the role of comparative criminal law in the EU and punishability of inchoate offences (TR, HU, DE).</p> <p>The <i>Comparative Criminology</i> module includes a discussion of the basic concepts in criminology first and then moves with the discussion of the main purposes of doing comparative research in criminology. Selected comparative issues include theoretical and methodological challenges confronted when conducting comparative research in criminology, measurement of crime across nations, advantages and limitations of various sources available for examining cross-national differences in levels/trends of crime (that is, both official and unofficial sources including international self-report delinquency studies and international crime victimization studies), explaining cross-national differences in levels of crime with specific reference to general theoretical frameworks commonly employed in criminology for explaining cross-national variation in crime rates and to empirical research findings.</p>
